## God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"When Jesus came down from the mountainside, large crowds followed him. A man with leprosy came and knelt before him and said, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean."

Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!"

Immediately he was cleansed of his leprosy." (Matthew 8:1-3, NIV)

As 2024 begins, my thoughts have been fixed once more on hope. The new year, with its sense of new beginnings, tends to push us to live with hope. I know I've shared over the past few months on this word hope, but hope is something I can't get away from.

Hope is something we affix to our wishes and desires for the way things will be. Hope is meant to be more
 than self-focused. Hope is meant to show us the very heart of God, the promises He makes to us, and the

plans He has for our lives. In looking at Jesus, we get to know this fully.

There's a scene from Matthew's Gospel that points this out directly. Moments after Jesus has preached his longest recorded sermon from a mountainside, as He comes down, a man parts the crowd and rushes forward to Jesus. Maybe it was Jesus' words about those who are "poor in spirit" or "mourning" that drew this man near to Christ. All we know is this man had leprosy.

Leprosy is something we understand a bit more now, but back then, it was downright scary to contract.

Many assumed it was caught and passed because of unconfessed sin. We know it was a contagious disease,

one that impacted everything about a person's life.

A person with leprosy was subjected, no matter what their state in life before contracting the disease, to a life of being an outcast. Not only would skin pigmentation change, but that very skin could fall off in a moment's notice. And everyone wanted to keep their distance.

It's this man, who everyone is afraid of, who runs to Jesus. He, in one statement, asks a profound question

of Christ's heart. He asks Jesus if He is willing. And Jesus says, "He is."

Dane Ortlund, in his book "Gentle and Lowly," writes about this passage: "The word 'will' in the leper's request...is the Greek word for wish or desire. The leper was asking about Jesus' deepest desire. And Jesus revealed His deepest desire by healing him...The Jesus given to us in the Gospels is not simply one who loves, but one who is love; merciful affections stream from His innermost heart as rays from the sun."

Jesus' deepest desire for our lives is to experience healing. His heart is affectionate and compassionate towards us in a way that desires to bring us hope. He longs that our lives would be lived from this place of trusting who He is. His deepest desire is that we would know we are loved.

In the leper, we are invited to see ourselves. No, we may not have a disease that affects our bodies. But we do have a disease that has devastated our souls. We have contracted sin and it has devastated us. It leaves us in a state where we are changed. Most of all, sin speaks lies that we are unlovable. But the voice of Jesus claims that He is willing. His deepest desire is that we would be healed, and not just physically. His desire is that we be healed body, mind, and soul. And He willed to do that for you, through His sacrifice and resurrection for us.

This is what gives us life, peace, and hope. In rooting ourselves in this news, we can live our life with the promise of hope. Hold on to that and hold on to His heart in 2024. He will not fail but will heal you.
