God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

In 2024, I've decided I'd like to read through the Bible again. I've been steadily working my way through it with the help of a reading plan. As I was reading today, I was reminded of a video I saw recently put together by The Bible Project (if you're unfamiliar with them, check out their work at bible project.com).

In this video devotion, the focus was on the words God says of Himself when He meets with Moses in Exodus 34:5-7. In that passage, we read these words, "Then the LORD came down in the cloud and stood there with him and proclaimed his name, the LORD. And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation." (NIV Translation)

As Michael Card notes in his book, <u>Inexpressible</u>, "The order is significant. Notice the first word is not holiness or power but compassion...It is linked to the [Hebrew] word rechem or "womb" and connotes the love elicited by a helpless baby from a mother or father." Further, if we look at the English definition, we see that compassion is to see another, feel with them in their situation, and do something about it.

To put it simply, it is love in action."

I find it significant that of all the places God could start in defining His character, He starts with compassion. Though God is love, He is first and foremost filled with compassion. In meditating on this news, I am reminded of the profound love God has for me, and this news has empowered my prayer life.

Prayer invites us to be still and pay attention to what God is doing. We are invited to look intently at Jesus. In Jesus, this characteristic was displayed fully. In seeing Jesus' compassion, our prayers are to be empowered and our faith is strengthened.

One scene when Jesus showed His compassion involved a guy by the name of Bartimaeus (found in Mark 10:46-52). Bartimaeus was blind and helpless. The people also shunned their eyes away from him,

even trying to shut him up because they felt Jesus was far too important for him.

But what does Jesus do? He calls Bartimaeus to Him. Jesus draws Bartimaeus to Him. He sees Bartimaeus, He feels with Bartimaeus, and He does something about it. Notice how Jesus doesn't assume what Bartimaeus wants. Instead, Jesus asks him a very deep and personal question, "What do you want me to do for you?"

Bartimaeus offers up his "prayer" to see. As Jesus listens to and acts for this helpless one, Jesus has compassion on Bartimaeus. Jesus' love is put in action, and Bartimaeus is healed! Bartimaeus then joins in the crowd and follows Jesus. Bartimaeus is never the same again because he has experienced the compassion of God.

In prayer, we, too, become open to experience the compassion of God. We are reminded that we are seen, loved, and acted for in Jesus. When we start our prayers from this place of professing God's character that we have received, it empowers our prayers and strengthens our faith.

This year, what if we learned how to pray in such a way so as to experience that compassion in new and wonderful ways? May Jesus show you how He can answer your prayers like He did for Bartimaeus. May this year truly change your life through His love in action.
