God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"Let each generation tell its children of your mighty acts; let them proclaim your power." (Psalm 145:4, NLT)

Have you ever had more than you can handle? Who did you turn to when you were overwhelmed? In 2020, I officiated the funeral for a young family that passed away in a house fire. This family was a part of the congregation I served, and it was incredibly difficult. When I received the call about what had happened and spoke with the family, I knew the road that was ahead of me, and I, quite honestly, did not want to walk it. This situation required me to be "the strong one," but at that moment, I wasn't feeling it all.

I decided to text some of my close friends to let them know and to ask for prayer. I barely pushed the "send" button, when my friend, Dave, called me back. He wept with me, prayed for me, and shared words of encouragement. His support in that moment, and the support of my friends over the next few days and weeks, helped me serve this family (and the community) during this time of incredible loss. As they lifted us up, we all experienced the power of God in an inexplicable way.

We all need support systems at times. Life will give us more than we can possibly handle and we will want to escape from it at times. It's then that we need someone we can turn to who will be there, speak encouragement, and strengthen us.

This is one of the main roles of the Church, the Body of Christ. We are to strengthen and support each other, encourage and bless, pray and share with one another. It's through our active witness that the power of the Holy Spirit becomes known.

Did you know that among those who are ages 16 to 24 in the US, research is revealing that 1 in 4 express feeling lonely? Loneliness has many factors, but it does include a lack of a support system. Now, we can correlate a lot of reasons as to why this is so, but what if we as the Body of Christ could somehow make sure those in our midst know they have one in us?

There is a way! Last week, I shared about the book "Growing Young." The authors are a part of the Fuller Youth Institute, where they conduct research on ways we can promote "Sticky Faith" ("a faith that sticks") in our congregations for the powerful transfer of the Gospel. Want to know something cool they found in their work? Kids can grow up knowing their support system and all they need are FIVE people in their life to do so. Five extra people who know a kid's name, pray for them, learn about their interest, show up on a regular basis, and who love them. Five people who point a kid to the love of Jesus, and a life that becomes healthy and whole into adulthood and further. Now, who wouldn't want that?!?

In this year, let's continue to think about and act on these things. Which kid in our congregation can you get to know a little more? How can you pray for them? Start there and let's see what power God can bring about! *Pastor Brandon*
