#### God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"If you put these things before the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, being trained in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine that you have followed. Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come." (1 Timothy 4:6-8)

This summer, I celebrate my 20-year class reunion! I know what some of you are thinking...twenty years is nothing. And you're right; in the grand scheme, twenty years is not a whole much. Yet, as I approach this time of being joined with my high school peers, I also see a lot that has happened in these twenty years. In truth, when I thought of the year 2024 then and all it would hold, it seemed so far away. And yet, it came fast.

This reflection has made me think of how the future comes a lot sooner than we think. In thinking back, I'm also thinking ahead. What's going to happen in the next twenty to thirty years? What changes

• are going to be present in our world? What are the issues going to be facing folks then?

This has led me to consider Abounding Joy. In twenty years, we'll be over thirty years old as a congregation! What's the story going to be of this place then? Isn't it exciting to think about what could be and what stories we can tell from that standpoint? What about all the people who will have a connection to this congregation then? I get pumped for what God could do in that time and what we're going to learn.

I admit, I've been guided to think about this based on another book I'm reading, called "Resilient" by Valerie Bell, the CEO of a child discipleship program called Awana. In this book, Bell asks these same questions in regards to the faith of our kids. What will the world look like when our kids are adults? How will they follow Jesus? What do they need now from the church to ensure that they are walking with Jesus then?

She showcases that the key to their faith, and to our story, is resilience. Resilience is what leads us to see that we may be knocked down, or we may have stumbled on our own, but we're not out. We can get back up and keep writing an incredible story. If you think of it, resilience is built into the DNA of the Church, and all through those years in history, it's resiliency that's helped the Church go through the dark times as well as the light. Here's the thing about resilience: it's taught and built. It's instilled now for when it's needed in the future. It comes through personal connection, care, and correction. It's found through training - being involved in and learning through today's challenges but in safe places, so that when life presents other challenges, hope can be seen and forward movement can take place. Here's the truth: in Jesus, we are resilient people.

We must aim to help our kids become resilient followers of Jesus, understanding that His love never fails us, it always forgives, it restores, and it makes new. We must also remember this, too. God is writing a story through Abounding Joy (one I'm so thankful and excited to be a part of). What does God want to accomplish through us? What does God want to accomplish through our kids? What do we need to

do today in order to see that happen?

God, by His Spirit, makes all this happen and He invites us to be a part of it with Him. We can train now for what's coming. And the days are coming. Like my reunion, they come faster than we think. Keep praying for our kids and our church. Keep showing up for others. Keep seeking Jesus. And the next thing you know, we'll have even more stories to tell of what He's done in these years. *Pastor Brandon*
