God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

But Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." (Matthew 19:26)

One of my favorite sayings that I think on often is this: "History is made in a moment, but you never fullly recognize it in the moment." As we enter into the month of February, this short month is packed full of history.

For instance, February is marked with times to remember our American history. This month is known as Black History Month - a time when we recognize the contributions of African Americans to our society, culture, and communities. February is also the month when we celebrate President's Day - a time when we think of the men who have led our country, from it's infancy all the way to today. We think on those stories as we remember their tremendous lives. February is a history remembering month.

In many of the stories we have, who would have thought in the moment it would have been so historic? For instance, when George Washington was passed over for promotion in the British army, who would have realized that this would be the catalyst that would launch his military career, guiding him to the role he would play as our first commander-in-chief during the American Revolution, and later America's first president? History is indeed made in a moment, but never fully recognized in the moment.

This is true in the stories in the Bible. For instance, Moses had a moment when he killed an Egyptian who was abusing an Israelite. When that was found out, Moses hightailed it to the desert, to live the rest of his days there. Yet, that moment led him to Mount Horeb, where He would encounter God in the burning bush and be commissioned to lead the people of Israel out of slavery. Yet, who would have known in that moment?

This is the thing: we rarely know when history will be made or who it will be made through. But God does. With God, history can be made! When we entrust those who we encounter to the love of God, well, who knows what God might accomplish through them!

Over these past few weeks, I've been sharing about the importance of knowing, loving, and serving the kids in our midst. There's so much we don't know about the future, but right now, we have a chance to help them belong, believe, and become followers of Jesus. In light of this, here's the question I'm wondering: does God want to make history through these lives?

What would it look like if every encounter we had with each other, and especially with a young person, was one where we saw things through this lens? What if we saw that the time talking to and encouraging a person was one where God could move in their hearts to believe in His great love? What if we took our chance to share about His grace and it changes a life?

I believe God is going to make history through these lives! God loves to meet people, sometimes when they're young and uninfluential, and make some history. He can do it in a moment. After all, it's the moment that matters. So, don't miss it because it truly might make history! *Pastor Brandon*

swering questions submitted by Confirmation Students. The purpose of Confirmation is to invite students and prepare them for a lifelong active faith lived out in the community of the church. One of the Confirmation expectations is that every student will attend and engage with Sunday wor-

ship and at least once a month fill out a Worship Note. There they can submit questions that they have about the service or faith in general. I've been asked some great questions and want to share them with the congregation.

Q: Why does our church say catholic instead of Christian church in the Apostles' Creed like my grandma's LCMC church?

A: Great Question. It's a question of translation. Catholic here isn't talking about a denomination but it is a word that means "universal". So, we're not confessing anything different than the church which says "Christian". Since it can get confusing, German Lutherans have traditionally translated it as Christian so that everyone knows what we mean.

Other traditions who came to the US from other places such as England or Sweden have traditionally used the word "catholic".
