#### God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work." (1 Thessalonians 5:12-13)

As I shared in last week's devotional, this month is marked by remembering history. It is a time, particularly in America, when we look back on the lives of those who made an impact on our country and how their stories still shape us today. There are also other person's who leave an impact on us, one that is more deeply felt. It's those who leave a legacy of faith for us to follow.

So, for the next few weeks, I'm going to introduce you to a few history-makers whose lives of faith-

fulness have impacted me significantly.

The first one I'd like to introduce (or reintroduce) to you is Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Dietrich Bonhoeffer lived in Germany and one of the main ways he is remembered is for the role he played in an effort to take out Adolf Hitler during WWII. However, more than that, Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran pastor and theologian who called people to faithfully follow Jesus, even when it could cost them their lives.

Bonhoeffer was born to a wealthy family in Germany. His parents were very smart people (his dad was a psychologist and colleague of Sigmund Frued), but his early years were not filled with much religious background. We could say they were marginally attached to the church. However, those little seeds were enough, for by the time Dietrich had finished confirmation, he was determined to become a theologian.

Fast-forward a few years later, and Dietrich's brilliant mind landed him in an associate pastor role that included training youth. Dietrich was a youth pastor and was deeply beloved. Though he would still become educated and love learning, this was where his pastoral heart began to take shape. He realized

that God made him to be a pastor.

As Dietrich began pastoring, so did tensions between Germany and the world. Dietrich started to become an outspoken critic of Adolf Hitler. He also wrote to the church of Germany to not join forces with the state, but instead to stand steadfast with Christ, even if they should die. He reminded them through his most famous book, "The Cost of Discipleship" this corrective: "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."

Eventually, Bonhoeffer would live by those words. As Germany grew in power and the church of Germany capitulated to Nazi regime, Bonhoeffer led the training of pastors through an illegal seminary. He also became a target, for which he was later arrested and convicted, for his role in Abwehr, a German intelligence organization that plotted several assassination attempts on Hitler. He was sentenced to Tegel prison, and as he awaited sentencing, he ministered to other prisoners and guards.

Bonhoeffer was found guilty, without any evidence against him, and was hanged in April 1945 at

Flossenbürg concentration camp. He is a modern-day martyr.

Bonhoeffer's life was incredible and to this day, his teachings are still profound. But throughout his life and ministry, Jesus Christ was the one he lived to glorify. Whether in life or death, Dietrich Bonhoeffer was Christ's, and that was all he wanted others to know. We thank God for Dietrich Bonhoeffer's faithful witness to Jesus Christ.

"What is the "extraordinary"? It is the love of Jesus Christ himself, love that goes to the cross in suffering obedience." *Pastor Brandon*
