God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." (Galatians 6:9-10)

It is so important for us to remember our history and the example of courageous people of faith. It is these people who point us to being faithful witnesses of Christ in our time and place.

The next history-maker I'd like to introduce (or reintroduce) you to is Corrie Ten Boom. Corrie lived in Holland at the same time as Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and played an instrumental role in protecting and saving the lives of numerous Jews as the Nazis occupied the Netherlands.

As the youngest daughter of the Ten Boom clan, Corrie joined in the family business of watchmaking. Corrie proved to be very astute with financial matters, and quickly began managing the business while also working. The family shop was also their home, a large building called "The Beje" located in Haarlem. Out of this building, many could come and find comfort or aid from the Ten Boom family.

Corrie not only served faithful in the family business, but was a dedicated woman to her church community. She loved serving in her church, and especially cared for young woman. She often taught "youth clubs" for the teenage girls, providing them with wisdom and instruction in the Christian faith.

Then, in 1940, things changed. As the Nazi regime took over the Netherlands, youth clubs were banned and stopped. Soon, Jewish people were being sought out and arrested. On a fateful night, one Jewish woman came to the Beje seeking refuge from the Ten Booms. From this moment on, the Ten Booms began a secret operation in their home to house, hide, and help Jewish people escape arrest from Nazis. These efforts would last for four years, and the Ten Boom's faith in Jesus guided them always.

However, the Nazis became aware of what the Ten Booms were doing. In 1944, their home was raided and they were arrested. Corrie was sent to Ravensbrück concentration camp, along with her older sister Betsie. Somehow, they smuggled a Bible in and led worship services for the women there, with many converting to Christianity due to their kind and faithful witness.

While Corrie struggled mentally being in the camp, Betsie reminded Corrie of God's goodness and to look for it. Many times, Corrie explains how she was surprised that God found her in that place. However, Betsie's health began to deteriorate drastically. She eventually succumbed to the poor treatment and passed away. While Corrie mourned, twelve days later, she received unexpected news in her release, due to a clerical error. She later learned that a week after her release, all women her age were placed in the gas chambers.

After WWII ended, Corrie continued to relentlessly share of the goodness of God despite such tragedies and devastation caused by the Nazis. She would later write a best-selling book called "The Hiding Place" detailing her life. She also reopened the Beje as a center for others to find refuge and spoke all over the world about faith in Jesus.

One of her most famous quotes is: "Do you know what hurts so very much? It's love. Love is the strongest force in the world, and when it is blocked that means pain. There are two things we can do when this happens. We can kill that love so that it stops hurting. But then of course part of us dies, too. Or we can ask God to open up another route for that love to travel."

Throughout the course of her life in service to Christ and others, Corrie modeled a person who asked God for routes for His love to travel through her. And she has. We thank God for faithful witnesses and history-makers like Corrie Ten Boom. *Pastor Brandon*
