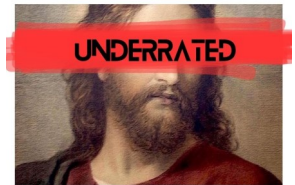

God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, 'I will be clean.' And immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean." (Mark 1:41-42)

Today is a gift from God! It's a day to enjoy and one to commune with God's Spirit. Throughout this Lenten season, we've been reminded how important each day is and that as each of us only gets 24 hours each day, we have a gift to help us live intentionally and purposefully every day. It comes through talking with God in prayer.

Prayer was an important part of Jesus' life. It was what guided Him and helped Him be refreshed in the love of God. When we model our lives after Jesus, we find a new phase opening up in our relationship with God. A deeper desire grows for connection with God.

This deeper connection flows out to somewhere else, and we find it connected to the bigger context in the passage quoted above. Jesus had an important aspect to Jesus' mission that came out of His prayer life – He was a healer. In these verses, we learn of a man who was shunned by the world around him. But he came to know Jesus, and in this, he placed his hope and trust in Jesus to be his healer. This man had immense faith – but his circumstances were also dire. He had two options – either take the chance and ask Jesus to heal him, or continue to live with his leprosy.

We can do desperate things when we're in desperate situations. I'm sure over the course of your life you've heard stories of people who have done some pretty risky things – and for some it has paid off. Maybe you've done risky things and had them pay off. This was what the man in the passage came to grips with. His faith was risky and needed to be.

Risky faith comes through a relentless pursuit after God's heart. Know where that starts? In prayer. As we begin engaging God in prayer, we are filled with a new boldness to do powerful things for God's glory. But, we also come to understand more about ourselves as sinful people in need of grace. The man in the story had come to this understanding as well. He needed to be clean, and He knew the only one who could cleanse Him completely. We, too, need that same cleansing.

Sometimes I think that my sins are too great for Jesus to forgive. When I think that, I forget who He is. But Jesus thinks differently. Notice how He responds to the leper – with compassion. He says He is willing to cleanse. He is ready to meet you and I right where we're at and provide for us. What do you need Him to cleanse in you today? Talk to Him about what in your life needs His powerful touch.

Remember, Jesus is stronger than our sins. He paid the price on the Cross to take away all our sins. He came to cleanse us of our sins and He is willing to do so in you. Continue to draw near to Him this Lenten season and let Him heal you with His touch. *Pastor Brandon*
