God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed." - John 17:4-5

Whenever we stick with something, we always focus on what's to come at the outcome. When we can see that something great is the outcome, we will stick with it. When I was 22, I ran a full marathon (the first and only one for me). There were parts that were hard and difficult, but I knew that when I finished, I would experience joy for sticking with it and finishing it.

As Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane, when He was considering sticking with God's salvation plan, He kept His eyes on something greater to come through it, something that was revealed on the third day after His death: glory.

The word "glory" has many meanings. For Jesus, the word would have brought to mind people of high importance, or situations of substantial significance. The word is identified with "heaviness." This moment, because of all that has happened, matters the most. When I finished my marathon, I experienced glory. I had done it and I did it well! But the momentary glory I experienced after my marathon was NOTHING in comparison to the glory Mary Magdalene experienced that early Easter morning.

For Mary, the pain and turmoil of the past few days was heavy upon her soul. She was deeply grieved over the loss of her Lord and Savior's life. All she could muster the strength to do was come to the tomb, care for the body, and weep. Until she learned the body wasn't there! That's when she experienced the glory that mattered more than all - Jesus is alive! He resurrected and met her in the moment.

What Mary experienced in seeing and speaking with the resurrected Jesus was a heaviness that undid all her past heaviness. Mary was a witness of His glory and His presence. In Jesus' resurrection, we learn that He is still WITH us. Death could not remove His WITH-ness WITH us! In fact, death no longer gets to be the end of the story.

This part of the story of the Bible takes place in a garden, one similar to where the destruction of death began. But in this garden, new life grows and blooms. The Bible wants us to believe our God makes the way when there was no way so that we would follow WITH Him and live in His glory forever! In this garden, is the invitation laying before us to follow Jesus.

Today is when your life of following Him can begin. It's a daily commitment of practicing His presence. Because He lives, every day becomes a chance to experience His glory, building a life of seeing Him WITH you. *Pastor Brandon*


