God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

"Get Rid of the Fake ID"

In two weeks, I will be taking the week off to rest and recover. I am also afforded the opportunity to officiate a wedding for some friends of ours! I've been looking forward to this and am so thankful for the council's openness to allow me to do this for them. Officiants get the special opportunity to be with couples on this day, leading them to begin their married life worshiping God. In that, we also get to sign the marriage license with the main attendants – the witnesses.

A portion of my role as officiant is to ensure the identification of those witnesses. It is my role, on behalf of the state, to make sure these people are who they say they are. Well, how do I figure that out? I card them and ask for their ID.

This small, hard item that is carried in our back pockets and purses shares significant information. It also tells me some details. Whether it's a school card or a driver's license, each form of identification produces a profile, or simple details that are true about us. With our ID's, if the profile matches the person, access is granted to certain places and situations. Without them, we can't prove what is true about us and are denied.

Fake ID's also give a profile of a person. However, if a fake ID is in possession of a person who is not the one identified, it doesn't tell the truth. A fake ID seeks to deceive the one processing the information on that card. Fake ID's try to do the same thing real ID's do (getting access and proving certain truths), except they do it falsely.

Whether we like to admit it or not, each of us carries a fake ID at times. There are times it's easier to portray or profile ourselves as something that we really aren't, for the sake of getting access to someone or something. We sell ourselves out to fit into a standard set by someone else. We choose to live in someone else's defined identity rather than the one we already have.

Identity is something we are given and yet also actively reinforce. It can be hard to live into our identity because it requires vulnerability and authenticity. And while we may be able to be

those things with ourselves (even though sometimes that can be just as difficult), it's a different story with others. Real identity means we have to encounter love and live in that love. Fake ID's let us have an escape from doing the difficult work. But fake ID's only get us busted – and being busted makes life miserable.

In the Bible, there are lots of pictures of identity given, but there's one passage that stands out to me. It comes from the book of Song of Songs. In that book, there are a man and a woman. The woman declares an identity that is anything but miserable. She is a woman whose identity is, shall I say, "euphoric?"

Here's what she says in Song of Songs 2:16-17: My beloved is mine and I am his; he browses among the lilies. Until the day breaks and the shadows flee, turn, my beloved, and be like a gazelle or like a young stag on the rugged hills.

This woman is not "busted." She is found! In that state, she issues forth her identity – and it's found in love. The love that is there causes an unbridled zeal to live fully into that love because it is reciprocal and unending.

That sounds a lot like the stories Jesus told in Luke 15. That chapter is all about the lost being found. Being found is worthy of rejoicing and busting out in praise! That's what Jesus came to do. It's what He came to give you, help you reinforce, and live into.

When we carry our fake ID's around, showing them off, and working for access to what is not meant for us, we're seeking out misery. The Holy Spirit has not brought us into God's family to make us miserable, but to make us authentic with our brothers and sisters in faith and our God. In that authenticity, we will know the blazing strength of God's love at work in all of us.

Today, get rid of your fake ID. Confess to God your desire to keep carrying it around, rather than live in the identity of His child. Then be courageous and open yourself up to the church who you are and whose you are. Engage in conversation so that we could know one another as wetruly wish to be known. And let the Holy Spirit guide you to bust out in praise of who God says you are. *Pastor Brandon*
