

God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you."

He said to him, "Feed my lambs." (John 21:15)

God has given us a great life and there is so much to celebrate and thank Him for. But sometimes, when we mess up, we can forget the grace that's found in this moment. We tend to get stuck on them. I agree with what Pastor Kevin DeYoung says in these moments, "It's easy to become convinced that we can never change or that God is ready to kick us to the curb after we've screwed up in the same way for the millionth time."

We see this same attitude in Peter when Jesus comes to him in the very last chapter of John. Peter had messed up BIG TIME. He completely denied that he knew who Jesus was or that he was involved with Him right before Jesus died. This Peter – the one who knew who Jesus was and had a huge turning point in his life, the same guy who said he'd never abandon ship – flat out refused to be associated with Jesus, based on the questioning of a servant girl (who had absolutely no credibility in her society), and acted in a deceptive way. Peter grieved over the way he had treated Jesus, but Jesus confronts him.

Jesus talks to Peter. He doesn't avoid him, but sits down with Peter to have serious conversation. Jesus deeply loves Peter and He will not abandon him. But Jesus also needs to set some things straight with him. So, He sets Peter down to talk.

Jesus first calls Peter "Simon" – his old name. Jesus is pointing out to him that until Simon recognizes his wrong, he is still that old person. Jesus shows Simon the way to be made right again. But Jesus also changes His question each time. He is pushing Simon to understand the oaths he made to God. Jesus is really asking Simon if he is even His friend.

Imagine Jesus asking you that. "Are you even my friend?"

I believe all of us can relate to the feelings Simon Peter has here as he is confronted by the person he hurt. We all, even as followers of Jesus, have moments where we mess up BIG TIME. We know the feeling of guilt when we've messed up over and over again in the same way. It stings. It's not easy to look back on our lives and see how disgusting some moments have really been.

That is what is so great about this passage. Jesus asks a tough question, but He also gives a better answer. Peter's life is restored; but it's given new direction. Your life, though it's messy, is restored in Christ. You are given a new direction! So, meet with Jesus now this day, confess your sins, and have confidence that He forgives and restores you! 
<u>SUMMER CAMP</u> Have you Heard about Family Camp? Family camp is Bible camp for people of all
