#### God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

It is mid-October, which means matters in our world are changing right now. I think this is one of the best things about living in Minnesota. Fall is truly an experience we get to see, smell, and feel in real time.

For instance, when you look out the windows, what do you see? You see colors! We've got quite a few: green, red, yellow, orange, and brown can be spotted. Not only do we get these vibrant colors, we also can • smell the scents. Fall has a distinct aroma, filled with cinnamon, pumpkin, and cloves dominating the air. Then, finally, there's a feel to this time of year. Fall is famously known as sweater weather, because you • need one, with the cool, crisp air. And the last thing (that is, in my opinion the best) of fall is the beauty of the stars at nighttime. They are best shared with friends and family around a campfire.

Fall is truly an experience here. But no matter where you live, each place holds its own set of experiences. It's part of living right now that takes in these pieces and finds immense joy. Everything that is around you is something God specifically designed for you to see.

No matter where we are, Jesus is working in it. The Apostle Paul discovered that in his first few years of being a follower of Jesus. Let's learn a little bit about his story from Galatians 1:13-18. I encourage you to take a moment to read it in your Bibles.

Did you catch it? Paul shares what happened right after he came to know Jesus as Lord. Then he drops this little hint about going to Arabia. Do you know where Arabia is? Arabia is in the desert! It's the exact opposite of Minnesota right now, with the only exception being that in fall, life is dying and in the desert...well...

In the desert, there's an experience. It's dry, hot, and humid, and you definitely feel it. There are colors there, but because there is lots of sand, it's the same color with not a whole lot of vegetation. There are probably smells too, but I'm not quite sure I want to identify which ' ones. Most of all, the desert is a place of isolation.

The apostle Paul heads into Arabia on his own. Now, we know that Paul writes some great things in his letters about what Christ has done in our lives. He tells us • important words about our faith life and how to live for God. (In case you didn't know, much of the New Testament is written by Paul.) And sometimes when we read . about Paul in the Bible, we seem to think that when he came to know Christ everything happened immediately. But that isn't what happened.

Paul left everything he knew to go into the desert to sort things out in his faith life. How long did this take? Well, about three years. Paul was already a very smart guy – he was a Pharisee (these guys knew everything there was about being a Jew and being obedient to. God)! But Jesus surprised Paul, and Paul took the time to get to know Him. Paul lived in the desert for three years just so he could sort out all the kinks he had with Jesus. Before he said or wrote anything that we have. that helps us grow in our faith, he spent time working out what he believed.

That was an experience Paul had to take in. He had to see how Jesus was at work there so that wherever he went, he'd be looking for Jesus there. Paul found Jesus in all sorts of places with a well-formed faith that transformed (and still does) the world.

If Paul needed the experience in his world to figure that out, we can see that our today matters in seeing and knowing Jesus. And no matter where we are in our experience, our life is changing. But in the change, Jesus ' is alive and at work in you. Jesus also wants you to let His transformation occur in you. Let him have that time. Listen to others stories as you take that time. Remember, Growing with Jesus is a process that takes time, but you have to take the time. Will you take your time today to get to know Him? Pastor Brandon
