God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

In the next few days, we will have reached the eleventh month of the year! It's hard to believe that it's almost November again. As November starts, the world around us shifts. The temperatures continue to drop and it seems to happen fast. Along with this, the leaves finally fall, the grass starts to turn brown, and the last of the crops are harvested. It's a time where our world enters a time of rest and rejuvenation.

As that happens, a pause in production starts. November is the time where this pause begins to take effect. Which is why it's the perfect time to return thanks and praise to God. It's the right time to thank God for what He has done and begin rejuvenating for what He will do.

Sometimes it's hard to wrap our minds around this. For the last few months, our world has been active and going, so to stop and pause can feel abrupt. Then to shift
and add in praise to God. That can feel like a hard pivot, especially when we haven't practiced Sabbath.

Sabbath has always been designed to be a day when we pause and praise. We cease from our regular roles to celebrate how God has held the whole world together and brought good into our lives. Sabbath also readies us for times when we experience jubilee - a longer time of rejoicing in God. Sabbath sets us up to see God as worthy of our praise always.

But God is God. He's got the praise of all heaven with the angels and those who have already died being given to Him. Why would He need ours added on top of that? Let's read Psalm 95 to find out a little more of the why. Please take a moment to read this in your Bibles now.

Sabbath was a part of the world and it's rhythm when this psalm was written. It was a day of reflecting on God's creativity and goodness. It was also meant to be a day when we would be softened because we could stop and let God be God. Yet, as we stop, we are called to hear His voice and trust Him for what's to come. The psalmist writes to show us that His rest is one filled with praise.

God is inviting us to praise Him so that we experience His goodness in a way we wouldn't otherwise. Through praise, we are humbled, loved, and cared for. We "learn the rhythms of grace" (as Eugene Peterson put

it) and His mercy is new. Praise captivates our hearts and fills us with abounding joy.

This is why Sunday became such an important day for the disciples of Jesus. This was the day they stopped to get together to give God praise. Sunday was the day that Jesus came back to life, defeating death for all who would trust in Him. This day became significant to them because it meant that Jesus was really God who was with them. This day has been the day throughout history for all people who would claim Jesus as Lord.

Sunday becomes our day too. Yes, Jesus was God, but He was also human, just like you. He had limitations; He got hungry; He probably snored and farted; He was tempted to sin; He bled and He died just like we will and do. Jesus was a man. But Jesus was this God we've just mentioned! Jesus is the one worthy of all praise! Jesus brought us salvation and wants us to trust in Him! And this is something for us – God's heart is passionate about us knowing Him in our lives. When we know Him and are passionate about Him, we're connecting to God's heart. This passion shines through when we praise Him!

You see, God could have stayed in heaven, separated from us because of our sin. He could have looked on all our faults and stayed away. We often ask, "Couldn't there have been another way for God to bring salvation?" but we neglect to see that God did not even need to do that because He is righteous. But He didn't stay away. He came.

God's glory had something different in mind. God became a human, lived like a human, and died like a human to display something even greater – the depth of His love. God's glory is all about displaying the fullness of His love for us. This means that for us to know it, it would have to be shown to us in the most real way wecan grasp – through a human example, Jesus.

Jesus is worthy of worship and the reason we praise. God loved us enough to not let us stay lost, but that we would give Him the praise He deserves. Today, let your worship of God exist! You will be most fully alive when you're most fully satisfied with Him. Give Him your praise and celebrate in Him as you join our world in rest. *Pastor Brandon*

ceipt attached by Sunday, November 23. There is a gift card box provided on the display table in which to put your donated gift card. Cash donations are welcome! If you are aware of a family


