God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

Happy New Year!

In January, it feels a bit different to go into a store. It's not as busy and sometimes you can find great post-Christmas deals. In fact, as businesses start the new year, they will usually offer a special incentive to get you to come in and give them your patronage. Many work hard to invite you to "come" to them.

While we do have to go to businesses as they can meet our needs, one thing that is true in all business is that what's in your wallet is most important. Getting what's in it given freely is the goal. The best way to achieve that goal is to get your physical body present. Then a conversation can happen. Presence first, then proclamation. Even in our digital world, we are still much more prone to making a commitment (and a purchase) through personal connection.

Even though the Church is in a different sort of business, there's a bit of wisdom we can find here and remember. Invitation is crucial to starting a conversation and a personal connection. We want people to "come" to church! Yet, we also have to invite. We have to go out before people will come in.

John the Baptist knew this full well. His standard of practice shows us just what this can do. Let's take a moment and see this from Matthew 3:1-3. I invite you to take a moment to read this on your own.

The first thing Matthew shares about John is that He "came preaching" before he got places. People knew he was on his way over because they could hear him before he got there! John, as he was in the wilderness of Judea was letting the sound "go out" before he welcomed people in.

And John preached...and preached...and preached. He was heard and his message was repetitive. Like a jingle you can't get out of your head, John's words incentivized folks to enter into connection with him. What was John's tune? "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven

is at hand." John knew what business he was about and he kept to it.

John had to do this. It was a part of God's business to fulfill Scripture and John was used for that goal. John's words going out were making a way for the Messiah to come in. This way would help others discover the personal connection found in Christ so they could commit to Him.

That doesn't mean this is easy. Whenever a road is made, there's a lot of work that needs to happen. There's a lot of digging and laying before the final formation is settled. John's words were making a road for Jesus to come. Without the work he did in preaching, that way might not have been made. But John lived into the role God claimed for him before he was born. It was John's words that started a revolution in Israel and pointed the way to the future – it pointed everyone to Jesus as the Messiah.

And this makes me think, "Who's waiting on you to come? Who needs to hear your voice going out?" John "came preaching" so that the Messiah could be revealed to a people who desperately need Him. This holds true for our world: there are still many in need of Jesus, "but how are they to hear without someone preaching?" asks the apostle Paul. Did you realize there are people who need you to "come preaching"?

We need a new model of business as Christians. We need to be preaching! We need to be speaking about Jesus to others and proclaiming that repentance is available to all! We need to let the sound go out that His kingdom is here! Just as John was called into a life of pointing to Jesus, so are we. Our business is to make Jesus known in all the world. There is someone waiting on you to "come preaching" so that they will know. There's someone you're meant to invite to "come" and meet Jesus. In 2026, will you "go out" and try? Will you go in God's Spirit and point the way to Jesus? You might find that God's including you in a mighty way in His business! *Pastor Brandon*
