God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

One of my favorite lessons to teach in confirmation is on baptism. In this lesson, I invite parents in for a special session to join with their son or daughter. Over the 18 years of teaching these lessons, I've always done the same thing every time: I invite parents to bring pictures, dresses, or any other items from the day their child was baptized.

This lesson becomes even more special this way. The lesson ties together not only our beautiful theology around the sacrament, but also the emotion that comes from it. Each time, a parent will share a story or bring an item or picture from that moment. It is always touching and it brings home this point about the sacraments: these acts that we do have immense meaning because they have been done as an act of love for us.

In every one of us is a need to make meaning of the pieces of our lives. We are story-telling creatures and our minds are wired this way. When we can make meaning of our circumstances, we realize those situations matter and have a purpose. In that purpose, we can find life, no matter how hard, boring, or beautiful it may be going. We most want this to tell us that no matter what, we are loved.

I imagine that might have been what was going through John the Baptist's mind as he preached in the wilderness. Those days of preaching brought crowds, but John wasn't so much into the size of the crowds or who was in them. He wanted his preaching to mean something in folks' lives. He wanted his baptism to resonate with purpose. What purpose was that? Repentance.

John wanted people to realize that God's ways mattered. He wanted the Israelites to understand that what they were facing with the Romans and religious corruption wasn't purposeless. But, in truth, this task was a bit of a slog. I imagine there were days when he felt it was dragging on.

Until one day, a moment came that showed John why what he was doing was all worth it. Let's take a moment to read about it in Matthew 3:13-17 in our Bibles.

John's job was to prepare the way for the Lord and to make straight his path. Last week, I shared that laying a road is arduous work. Preparing a pathway takes time, energy, and diligence. John had been doing his job and the pathway was ready.

And then the Lord showed up and came straight to him. The way Matthew tells it, John was surprised when it happened. John even tried to stop the moment. Jesus speaks that this moment has meaning and what John is to do for Him in baptism will give it all its purpose.

For Jesus, the one never in need of repentance, receives the baptism for repentance. Through the water and the word, Jesus joins Himself to the repentant, the recipients of this act. Jesus supplies the meaning and makes baptism full of purpose. For in baptism, we are joined to Jesus our Lord. We are made the ones God loves.

Acts of love don't always make sense in the moment. But eventually, those acts become the right spot for a story to come. The story that came out of Jesus' baptism is one full of meaning for God Himself showed up and spoke. John would then know that it was all worth it. He was loved and his role had purpose. All because of Jesus.

That same news is true for you. God is showing up and speaking still, especially in the sacraments. He is present there to tell us about Jesus so that we would receive Him. In receiving Him in our present moment, we would be reminded that whatever our life holds - the good, the boring, or the bad - there is a purpose that God will use for His glory.

Just as in baptism, we don't capture it quite in the moment, soon enough the story emerges that gives all the meaning. Through these acts, we discover purpose. God gives purpose. He has made a way for you. He loves you. Let that love touch your life today.
