God's Word is Powerful and Sufficient

Have you ever cried yourself to sleep? If not, have you ever been so angry you wanted to punch something, or screamed into a pillow in your room?

Sometimes, we associate these actions as part of temper tantrums that toddlers have. Having lived through that recent stage with my children, there are times where I felt like doing the same. As we see in kids, and as we know as adults, emotions can be hard, especially when we face tough times.

Which makes me ask this question, "When things are going wrong, what do you do?" Do you scream, hit someone, or take it out on a spouse, friend, sibling or pet? Or do you get really quiet and need to separate yourself from everyone? Do you feel as though you just brood like a storm about ready to strike with fury?

Emotions make it hard for us to always know what to do when things are going wrong. Many times, we can feel bad for feeling emotions, especially negative ones. Yet, when we look at Jesus, we realize He expressed a lot of emotions when He went through a tough time. Reading through the Gospels, Jesus saw how things were going wrong. Jesus also showed us what to do when we go through them.

Before we see a few moments from Scripture from what Jesus shows us, I invite you to first read Hebrews 5:7 in your Bibles to help you grasp a bit more of the following scenes.

For instance, Jesus displayed great emotion in John 2:13-17. This moment occurred at Passover - the most important festival for the Jewish people, and probably the favorite one. As Jesus is heading to worship for His favorite worship service, things are not right in the Temple. Jesus displays what we consider to be a negative emotion: anger.

Another instance is in Matthew 17:14-18. Jesus has just been transfigured, comes down and heals a boy with a demon. As Jesus stepped into that situation, things were not going right. However, before doing miraculously, Jesus used his words to express what we would consider another negative emotion: frustration.

One more situation is from John 11:30-35. Lazarus had died and Jesus finally showed up for Mary and Martha. They both have some blunt words for Jesus. Things were not going right in this situation and there is hurt over the circumstances. In this moment, we see Jesus again expressing emotion: he weeps. He cries hard. He lets it out in a very expressive way.

These scenes are there in the Gospels to show us that there are times when things don't go right. Jesus knows about them and is well aware. He felt the wrongness of the moment and He let out His emotion. Doesn't it ever make you wonder what was going through His mind in these times? Especially knowing what He came to do.

For instance, what was going through Jesus' mind in Matthew 26:36-46. He was about to be arrested, beat up, spit at, bullied, teased, whipped, and nailed to a cross. After all of that, He was going to die a painful death being treated like a criminal when He had done nothing wrong. Jesus expressed His emotion, which was so intense that blood seeped from His eyes.

In all this, Jesus knew what was to come and why it came. He had an insight we don't. So, what He does in each of these moments reminds us what we should do when have a tough time: talk to our Father. Jesus told His Father what was on His heart. He expressed His zeal for His house, His exasperation at being used for blessings rather than followed, His pain over unnecessary loss, and His sorrow for what His life required.

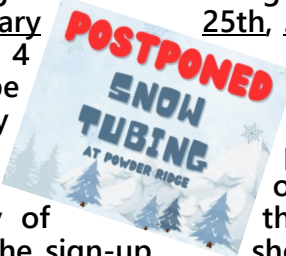
Jesus teaches us that our Father can handle anything we think or feel. As He helped Jesus deal with His feelings, He will help us. As He did with Jesus, the tough times can be used for His plan and purpose in our lives. They can be the vessel through which we experience His resurrection life in us.

Tough times are going to keep coming. Yet, we can be like Jesus. We can express our emotions. We can pray. We can find help because our God is good. He loves us. He will use the tough times for something amazing. Talk to Him. Let Him in. See what He will do.
