

Faith Comes by Hearing Bible Study – 2.4.26 (For 2.8.26)

First Reading: Ezekiel 36:22-28

²²“Therefore say to the house of Israel, Thus says the Lord God: It is not for your sake, O house of Israel, that I am about to act, but for the sake of my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations to which you came. ²³And I will vindicate the holiness of my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned among them. And the nations will know that I am the Lord, declares the Lord God, when through you I vindicate my holiness before their eyes. ²⁴I will take you from the nations and gather you from all the

countries and bring you into your own land. ²⁵I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. ²⁶And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. ²⁷And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules. ²⁸You shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers, and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

1. Through Ezekiel, God makes a promise to His people to restore them. What does God share is the reason for His action? Why is this good news?
2. God uses the language of cleansing and replacing. What does He cleanse? What does He replace?
3. God also promises His Spirit. How will the Spirit help us and show us that God has been faithful to His promises?

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:15-21

¹⁵Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. ¹⁸And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit,

¹⁹addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, ²⁰giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

1. In Ephesians 5, Paul has emphasized that Christians are to be imitators of Jesus. In this section, he begins with a word of warning. What does he call us to pay attention to? How do we do this?
2. Paul contrasts a life of debauchery with life in the Spirit. What are the significant differences? Are there others?

3. How does verse 21 connect these commands together? What does this look like in our daily lives?

Gospel: John 16:4b-15

^{4b}“I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵But now I am going to him who sent me, and none of you asks me, ‘Where are you going?’ ⁶But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. ⁷Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰concerning righteousness, because I go to the

Father, and you will see me no longer; ¹¹concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

¹²“I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

1. Jesus prepares His disciples for His departure by also promising someone better to come. Who is coming? How will this one come?
2. When the Spirit comes, what will He do? How will this comfort the disciples?
3. How does the Holy Spirit "glorify" Jesus? How will His words guide us?
